The meeting will begin promptly at 11:00 a.m. with the first section which is called Audience Comments. The Audience Comment portion of the agenda is where individuals may comment on matters for which the Board may be taking action or that may otherwise concern the District. Each individual is limited to three (3) minutes for such comment. The Board of Supervisors or Staff is not obligated to provide a response until sufficient time for research or action is warranted. IF THE COMMENT CONCERNS A MAINTENANCE RELATED ITEM, THE ITEM WILL NEED TO BE ADDRESSED BY THE DISTRICT MANAGER OUTSIDE THE CONTEXT OF THIS MEETING. The second section is called Business Items. The business items section contains items for approval by the District Board of Supervisors that may require discussion, motion and votes on an item-by-item basis. Occasionally, certain items for decision within this section are required by Florida Statute to be held as a Public Hearing. During the Public Hearing portion of the agenda item, each member of the public will be permitted to provide one comment on the issue, prior to the Board of Supervisors' discussion, motion and vote. The third section is called Business Administration. The Business Administration section contains items that require the review and approval of the District Board of Supervisors as a normal course of business. Agendas can be reviewed by contacting the Manager's office at (239) 936-0913 at least seven days in advance of the scheduled meeting. Requests to place items on the agenda must be submitted in writing with an explanation to the District Manager at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the meeting. The fourth section is called Staff Reports. This section allows the District Manager, Engineer, and Attorney to update the Board of Supervisors on any pending issues that are being researched for Board action. The final section is called Supervisor Requests and Comments. This is the section in which the Supervisors may request Staff to prepare certain items in an effort to meet residential needs.

Public workshops sessions may be advertised and held in an effort to provide informational services. These sessions allow staff or consultants to discuss a policy or business matter in a more informal manner and allow for lengthy presentations prior to scheduling the item for approval. Typically no motions or votes are made during these sessions.

Call to Order

Ms. Syvret called the meeting to order and read the roll call.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ms. Syvret presented the minutes of the special Board of Supervisors' meeting held on July 24, 2013. She asked if there were any questions related to the minutes. Mr. Dady stated on page four the word "Group" was missing from the name of the SPE.

On a Motion by Mr. Bishop, seconded by Mr. Wasser, with all in favor, the Board approved the Minutes of the Special Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on July 24, 2013, subject to the revision noted on the record, for CFM Community Development District.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for the Month of July 2013

Ms. Syvret provided an overview of the expenditures paid for the period of July 1-31, 2013 which totaled \$44,666.87. She asked if there were any questions related to any item of expenditure. Discussion ensued regarding various items of expenditure.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board approved the Operation and Maintenance Expenditures for the Period of July 1-31, 2013, which totaled \$44,666.87, for CFM Community Development District.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mr. Bowen provided an overview of the Resolution for the Board, which outlines recommended procedures and guidelines for public comment.

On a motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board adopted Resolution 2013-09, Providing for the Public's Opportunity to be Heard; Designating Public Comment Periods; Designating a Procedure to Identify Individuals Seeking to be Heard; Addressing Public Decorum; Addressing Exceptions, for CFM Community Development District.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion Concerning Rules of Procedure

Mr. Bowen explained the Rules have not been updated for several years, during which time legislative changes have occurred, therefore it is recommended that the District update its Rules of Procedure to be consistent with such changes. Discussion ensued.

On a motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board authorized District Staff to proceed with Updating the Rules of Procedure and providing for proper notice, for CFM Community Development District.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2013-10, Designating the Date, Time and Place of a Public Hearing and Authorization to Publish Notice of Such Hearing for the Purpose of Adopting Rules of Procedure

Mr. Bowen provided an overview of the Resolution and asked if there were any questions. There were none.

On a motion by Mr. Wasser, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board adopted Resolution 2013-10, Setting a Public Hearing on the Rules of Procedure for Thursday, November 21, 2013 at 11:00 a.m., to be held at the office of the District Manager, located at 9530 Marketplace Road, Suite 206, Fort Myers, Florida 33912, and further Authorized Staff to Publish Notice of such Hearing, for CFM Community Development District.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Hearing Related to Debt Special Assessments

Mr. Bowen provided an overview of the hearing process and provided background on the purpose of the hearing.

Ms. Syvret confirmed proper notice and then asked for a motion to open the public hearing related to debt special assessments.

On a motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Wasser, with all in favor, the Board Opened the Public Hearing related to Debt Special Assessments, for CFM Community Development District.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Resolution 2013-11, Approving and Confirming Reallocated Special Assessments on Property Specially Benefited by the District's Capital Improvement Plan

Mr. Robson provided an overview of the Engineers Certificate dated August 9, 2013. He further advised the different items which benefit from the lands of the District were identified and are subject to the improvement. Mr. Robson confirmed there have been no changes in the findings that were previously mentioned regarding the reasonableness of the cost estimate and feasibility of the project.

Mr. Cox provided an overview of findings in the financial consultant certificate dated July 24, 2013. He advised there is no change in the methodology. Mr. Bowen asked Mr. Cox to confirm that the lands that are being charged a special assessment receive a benefit from the project and that the special assessments are reasonably allocated to the lands being charged for the special assessments. Mr. Cox confirmed that there have been no changes regarding the benefit received and the reasonableness of the apportionment of the assessment.

Mr. Bowen stated for the record that there were no members of the public present.

Mr. Dady stated for the record that the ownership of the additional lands recently changed and the SPE entity that owns the property is now in the process of engaging a new land plan, though finalized plans are not available yet. He indicated that this represents the best available information as to what density will be at this time, but that will be looked at in the ensuing year; the same comment goes for the operation and maintenance budget which tracks the number of assessments with an eye toward the residential lands that are now owned by a different entity than the golf course. There are now two separate entities and the SPE will be working with the golf course ownership in the coming year to ensure that responsibilities, easements, and associated costs are properly allocated as we move forward.

Mr. Bowen provided an overview of the Resolution.

On a motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board adopted Resolution 2013-11, Approving and Confirming Reallocated Special Assessments on Property Specially Benefited by the District's Capital Improvement Plan, for CFM Community Development District.

Mr. Bowen advised there was no further business to be conducted during this public hearing and he asked for a motion to close the public hearing.

On a motion by Mr. Bishop, seconded by Mr. Wasser, with all in favor, the Board Closed the Public Hearing related to Debt Special Assessments, for CFM Community Development District.

The board discussed various line items of the budget. The line items for electric utility services was decreased to \$15,000 and the a new line item in the amount of \$1,800 was added for gatehouse maintenance.

Mr. Bowen provided an overview of the Resolution for the Board.

On a motion by Mr. Bishop, seconded by Mr. Wasser, with all in favor, the Board adopted Resolution 2013-12, Annual Appropriations and Adopting the Budget for Fiscal Year 2013/2014, in the amount of \$2,305,706.00, for CFM Community Development District.

FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

A public hearing to consider the imposition of operations and maintenance assessments pursuant to sections 190 and 197.3632(4)(b), Florida Statutes.

A special board meeting where the Board may consider any other business that may properly come before it.

Background

The District is an independent local unit of special-purpose government created in accordance with Chapter 190, Florida Statutes for the purposes of financing, constructing, acquiring, operating and maintaining public infrastructure improvements. The District encompasses approximately 981 acres of land located in northern Lee County, Florida. The District is bordered on the west by U.S. 41, bordered on the north by the Herons Glen development and the associated Heron's Glen Recreational District, and bordered on the south and east by undeveloped land.

The District previously issued its Series 2004A Capital Improvement Revenue Bonds (the "2004A Bonds") to fund a portion of the District's various infrastructure improvements ("Improvements"). The streets and areas that are the subject of the Improvements are depicted below and in the District's Engineer's Report dated April 2002 and subsequently amended in July 2003, April 2004 and May 2004, and which is on file in the District office and can be obtained upon contacting the District. As further described in the Engineer's report, the Improvements include, among other things, roadway improvements, street lights, utilities, stormwater management and

Debt Assessment Public Hearing

The District is contemplating reallocating the existing assessments securing the 2004A Bonds to account for the addition of certain lands to the District's boundaries by means of the Boundary Amendment adopted by the Lee County Board of County Commissioners as Ordinance No. 12-11 on May 30, 2012, and to fulfill certain obligations related to certain agreements entered into by the District, including that certain Forbearance and Modification Agreement executed on February 24, 2011 and that certain Project Transfer and Transition Agreement executed on April 18, 2013 ("Reallocated Assessments").

This public hearing will be conducted pursuant to Chapters 170, 190 and 197, Florida Statutes. A description of the property to be assessed and the amount to be assessed to each piece or parcel of property may be obtained at the District office located at 9530 Marketplace Road, Suite 206, Fort Myers, Florida 33912. At the conclusion of the public hearings, the Board will, by resolution, levy and reallocate assessments as finally approved by the Board.

The District intends to consider the imposition and/or re-allocation of non-ad valorem special assessments on benefited lands within the District in the manner set forth in the District's 2013 Assessment Roll, which was presented at the July 24, 2013 meeting of the Board of Supervisors ("Assessment Roll"), and in the District's Final Special Assessment Methodology Report, dated May 20, 2004, as supplemented ("Assessment Methodology", together with the Assessment Roll, the "Assessment Report"), which are on file in the District office and can be obtained upon contacting the District. The purpose of the Reallocated Assessments is to secure the repayment of the 2004A Bonds and to finance the Improvements. The process by which the allocation is to be made is set forth in the Assessment Report, and the maximum amounts to be allocated by product type are as set out in the Assessment Report.

The District's Reallocated Assessments will apply in the manner set forth in the Assessment Report. The Assessment Report contains a listing of each tax parcel identification number within the District; the allocation of the Reallocated Assessments per parcel; and the method of allocation of the Reallocated Assessments for the land use categories that are expected to be assessed as development progresses. As more fully described in the Assessment Report, debt assessments for sold homes are assigned based on an equal assessment per lot basis. The allocation of assessments to any undeveloped parcels is on an equal acreage basis as more fully described in the Assessment Report. All interested persons may ascertain the description of each property to be assessed and the amount to be assessed to each parcel of property at the District office identified above.

The total revenue the District will collect by the Reallocated Assessments, for all assessment areas is \$2,108,148.00 exclusive of collection costs and early payment discounts. The proposed schedule of Reallocated Assessments is as shown below. Amounts are preliminary and subject to change at the hearing. The amounts are subject to early payment discount as afforded by law.

These annual Reallocated Assessments will be collected on the Lee County tax roll by the Lee County Tax Collector. Whereas, this Resolution shall serve as the "resolution required to declare special assessments" contemplated by Section 170.03, Rlorida Statutes, for the assessment lien(s) levied against certain property as described in Exhibit B that collectively comprise the Reallocated 2004 Assessments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CFM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

- Section 1. The Reallocated 2004 Assessments shall be levied and reallocated to defray the cost of the Improvements described in the Engineer's Report.
- Section 2. The nature and general location of the Improvements that have been or will be constructed, installed, and/or acquired are more specifically described in the Engineer's Report, which is on file at the District Records Office.

- Section 7. There is, attached to the Engineer's Certificate attached as Exhibit A hereto, and on file at the District Records Office, an assessment plat showing the area that is to be assessed, together with certain plans and specifications describing the Improvements and the Project Cost, all of which shall be open to inspection by the public.

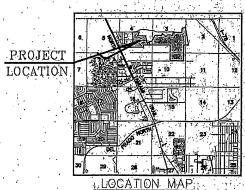

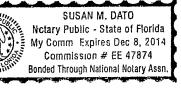

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CEM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT DECLARING AND REALLOCATING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS; INDICATING THE LOCATION, NATURE AND ESTIMATED COST OF THOSE INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS WHOSE COST IS TO BE DEFRAYED BY THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS; PROVIDING THE PORTION OF THE ESTIMATED COST OF THE IMPROVEMENTS TO BE DEFRAYED BY THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS; PROVIDING THE MANNER IN WHICH SUCH SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS SHALL BE MADE; PROVIDING WHEN SUCH SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS SHALL BE PAID; DESIGNATING LANDS UPON WHICH THE SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS SHALL BE LEVIED; PROVIDING FOR AN ASSESSMENT PLAT; ADOPTING A PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT ROLL; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION OF THIS RESOLUTION.

Whereas, the CFM Community Development District (the "District") is a local unit of special-purpose government organized and existing in accordance with the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, as amended; created by Ordinance No. 02-01 of the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida, effective on January 8, 2002; and

Whereas, on May 18, 2004, the District issued \$27,740,000 aggregate principal amount of CFM Community Development District (Lee County, Florida) Special Assessment Bonds, Series 2004A ("2004A Bonds") and \$15,200,000 aggregate principal amount of CFM Community Development District (Lee County, Florida) Special Assessment Bonds, Series 2004B ("2004B Bonds," collectively with the 2004A Bonds referred to as the "2004 Bonds"); and

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Whereas, with a portion of the proceeds from the 2004 Bonds, the District's Board of Supervisors (the "Board") undertook, installed, planned, established, constructed or reconstructed, enlarged or extended, equipped, acquired, operated, and/or maintained the infrastructure improvements described in the Engineer's Report dated April; 2002 as supplemented and amended by the First Supplemental Engineer's Report dated July, 2003, flie Second Supplemental Engineer's Report dated April, 2004, and the Amended Second Supplemental Engineer's Report dated May, 2004 (the "Engineer's Report"); and

Whereas, pursuant to Resolutions 2002-04, 2002-05, and 2002-06, as supplemented by Resolution 2004-04, among others, the District levied and imposed debt special assessments to secure the repayment of the 2004 Bonds ("2004 Assessments"); and

Whereas, pursuant to Resolution 2008-07, excess funds in the acquisition and construction account pertaining to the 2004 Bonds were applied to the extraordinary mandatory redemption of the 2004B Bonds and a portion of the 2004A Bonds, such that the 2004B Bonds are no longer outstanding; and

Whereas, on July 15, 2010, the District adopted Resolution 2010-05 authorizing the execution of a Forbearance and Modification Agreement, which was subsequently executed on February 24, 2011, and which relates to ramong other things, the collection of special assessments securing the repayment of the 2004A Bonds; and

Whereas, on May 30, 2012, the Board of County Commissioners of Lee County, Florida, adopted Lee County Ordinance No. 12-11 consenting to and authorizing the modification of the District's boundaries, specifically authorizing the addition of certain lands to the District's boundaries (the Boundary Amendment"); and

Whereas, on April 18, 2013, the District entered into that certain Project Transfer and Transition Agreement requiring, among other things, hat the District endeavor to reallocate assessments levied against certain property conveyed pursuant to said agreement, and

Whereas, the District has determined that, in light of the land added of the District's boundaries by means of the Boundary Amendment and the bligations undertaken by entering into the Project Transfer and Transition Agreement, it is in the District's best interest now to move forward with ts plan of development ("Improvements"), as described in the Engineer's Report and as further addressed in the Engineer's Certificate attached hereto is Exhibit A, and to reallocate the Debt Assessments securing the 2004A Bonds; and

Whereas, it is in the best interests of the District to continue to pay the cost of the improvements as described in the Improvements through the levy of special assessments pursuant to Chapters 170 and 190, Florida. Statutes; and

Whereas, notwithstanding the District's adoption of this resolution to begin the process of levying the Reallocated 2004 Assessments, the existing 2004 Assessments proposed to be restructured shall remain valid and binding until such time as the District levies the Reallocated 2004 Assessments; and

Whereas, the District is empowered by Chapters 170, 190, and 197

Florida Statutes, to finance, fund, plan, establish, acquire, construct or reconstruct, enlarge or extend, equip, operate, and maintain the Improvements and to impose, levy and collect the Reallocated 2004 Assessments; and

Whereas, the District hereby determines that (i) benefits accrue to the property improved, (ii) the Reallocated 2004 Assessments to be levied and reallocated will not exceed the benefits to the property improved, and (iii) the Reallocated 2004 Assessments will be reallocated in proportion to the benefits received, all as set forth in the Financial Consultant's Certificate attached hereto as Exhibit B, and on file at the office of the District Manager, located at 9530 Marketplace Road, Suite 206, Fort Myers, Florida 33912, ("District Records Office"); and

Whereas, this Resolution shall serve as the "resolution required to declare special assessments" contemplated by Section 170.03; Florida Statutes, for the assessment lien(s) levied against certain property as described in Exhibit B that collectively comprise the Reallocated 2004 Assessments.

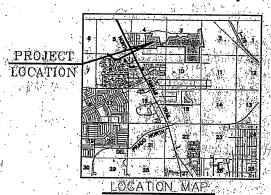
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CFM COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

- Section 1. The Reallocated 2004 Assessments shall be leyied and reallocated to defray the cost of the Improvements described in the Engineer's Report.
- Section 2. The nature and general location of the Improvements that have been or will be constructed, installed, and/or acquired are more specifically described in the Engineer's Report, which is on file at the District Records Office.
- Section 3. The total cost of the Improvements is \$30,279,570 (hereinafter, referred to as the "Project Cost").
- Section 4. The Reallocated 2004 Assessments as reallocated will continue to defray approximately \$25,888,857.55, which includes a portion of the Project Cost plus financing related costs, capitalized interest, debt service reserve and contingency, as applicable.
- Section 5. The manner in which the Reallocated 2004 Assessments shall be re-apportioned and paid is set forth in the Assessment Roll attached to the Financial Consultant's Certificate attached as Exhibit B, and on file at the District Records Office.
- Section 6. The Reallocated 2004 Assessments, as reallocated, shall be levied on lots and lands, including the lands added in the Boundary Amendment, within the District that are adjoining and contiguous or bounding and abutting upon such Improvements or specially benefitted thereby and further designated by the assessment plat hereinafter provided for.
- Section 7. There is, attached to the Engineer's Certificate attached as Exhibit A hereto, and on file at the District Records Office, an assessment plat showing the area that is to be assessed, together with certain plans and specifications describing the Improvements and the Project Cost, all of which shall be open to inspection by the public.

Assessments were originally confirmed (i.e., in 2006), the Reallocated 2004 Assessments shall be paid in not more than (30) thirty annual installments. The Reallocated 2004 Assessments may be payable at the same time and in the same manner as are ad-valorem taxes and collected pursuant to chapter 197, Florida Statutes; provided, however, that in the event the uniform non ad-valorem assessment method of collecting the Reallocated 2004 Assessments is not available to the District in any year, or if determined by the District to be in its best interest, the Reallocated 2004 Assessments may be collected as is otherwise permitted by law. The decision to collect special assessments by any particular method – e.g., on the tax roll or by direct bill—does not mean that such a method will be used to collect special assessments in future years, and the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to change collection methods, regardless of past practices.

- Section 9. The District Manager has caused to be made a preliminary assessment roll, attached to the Financial Consultant's Certificate attached as Exhibit B hereto, which shows the lands assessed, the amount of benefit to and the assessment against each parcel of land and the number of annual installments into which the assessment may be divided, which is hereby adopted and approved as the District's Preliminary Supplemental Assessment Roll.
- Section 10. The Board shall adopt a subsequent resolution to fix a time and place at which the owners of property to be assessed or any other persons interested therein may appear before the Board and be heard as to the propriety and advisability of reallocating the assessments of the making of the Improvements, the cost thereof, the manner of payment therefor, or the amount thereof to be assessed against each property as improved.
- Section 11. The District Manager is hereby directed to cause this Resolution to be published twice (once a week for two (2) weeks) in a newspaper of general circulation within Lee County and to provide such other notice as may be required by law or desired in the best interests of the District.
- Section 12. This Resolution is intended to supplement the prior District's debt assessment resolutions relating to the debt service assessments securing the Series 2004A Bonds, including but not limited to Resolution 2002-06. As such, all such prior resolutions, including, but not limited to, Resolutions 2002-04, 2002-05, 2002-06, and 2004-04 remain in full force and effect, except to the extent provided for herein.
- Section 12. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage.

1. - System inspections O/M

Wet Detention - Inspection

- Inspections shall be conducted a minimum of annually.
- o Inspect for damage. Close attention should be given to the control structure and the Point of Discharge (POD).
- o Note any undercutting, piping, or signs of erosion near inflow pipes, the outlet control structure, or flumes and schedule for repairs if necessary.
- Note turbid or impacted water quality.
- Note sedimentation of pond bottom.
- Note signs of excessive total petroleum hydrocarbon contamination and handle appropriately.
- o Inspect for exotic or invasive vegetation.
- Note excessive trash.
- Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- o Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Canals - Inspection (None in Inventory)

- o District canals shall be inspected annually.
- Visually inspect for any obstructions to flow. Clean out as needed.
- Visually inspect appearance of water in canal. Record problems: discoloration, fish kill,
 oil/grease sheen, algal bloom, etc.
- Inspect & record any erosion or sedimentation problems along banks.
- Note excessive trash.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

<u>Ditches</u>, catch basins, grates, inlets – Inspection

- o A minimum of 10% of District ditches shall be inspected yearly, so that all ditches shall be inspected over 2 permit cycles.
- Visually inspect for any obstructions to flow. Clean out as needed.
- Visually inspect appearance of water in ditch. Record problems: discoloration, fish kill, oil/grease sheen, algal bloom, etc.
- o Inspect & record any erosion or sedimentation problems along banks.
- Note excessive trash.
- Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- o Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Grass Swales - Inspection

- Swales shall be inspected annually.
- o Inspect for signs of prolonged wetness and damage to structures including diversion devices, inflow pipes, driveway culverts and swale blocks.
- Note any critically eroded areas on banks and front and back slope and swale bottom.
 Schedule for stabilization as necessary.
- o Note sedimentation of swale bottom.
- Note any undercutting at the point of discharge, paved flumes, pipes or culverts and schedule for repair.
- Note dead or dying grass along swale bottom. (This may be an indication of reduced infiltration capacity). Schedule for scraping, discing or other aeration practice.
- o Note excessive trash.
- Note signs of excessive petroleum hydrocarbon contamination and handle appropriately.
- Note if mowing schedule is adequate.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Culvert & Pipe - Inspection

- o A minimum of 10% of District pipes/culverts shall be inspected yearly, so that all pipes/culverts shall be inspected over 2 permit cycles.
- o Inspect for damage. Close attention should be given to the end treatments, headwalls and/or mitered ends.
- Note any undercutting or signs of erosion near inflow pipes, the outlet control structure, or flume and schedule for repairs if necessary.
- Visually inspect for any obstructions to flow. Clean out as needed.
- Note turbid or impacted water quality.
- o Note sedimentation / silting of structure bottom and clean as needed.
- Note signs of excessive total petroleum hydrocarbon contamination and handle appropriately.
- Note excessive trash.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- o Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Pollution Control Structures - Inspection (None in Inventory)

- o Inspections shall occur quarterly, unless historic records demonstrate otherwise.
- o Inspect for damage to structure. If fabric insert, inspect for tears. Repair as needed.
- Visually inspect for any obstructions to flow. Clean out as needed.
- Visually inspect appearance of water in ditch. Record problems: discoloration, fish kill, oil/grease sheen, algal bloom, etc.
- o Inspect & record any erosion or sedimentation problems.
- Note excessive trash.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- o Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Major Outfall - Inspection (None in inventory)

- o Inspections shall occur annually unless historic records indicate otherwise.
- o Inspect for damaged headwalls, pipe seepage, erosion of bank around outfall, erosion or sedimentation at discharge point, and clogged or damaged riprap.
- o Inspect for debris, litter or sediment that might clog outfall. Check that outfall is flowing properly.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

Weirs - Inspection

- Inspections shall occur annually.
- o Inspect for damage that would prevent proper flow conditions and operations.
- Monitor sediment accumulation behind weirs/control structures to prevent loss of storage volume or adverse impacts on flow and operation.
- o Monitor litter/debris accumulation.
- o Maintenance issues are directed to District Management for corrective action.
- o Inspections and maintenance are tracked by District Management.

3. - Procedures for Litter Control Program for highways and streets, including rights-of-way

Highways and streets within CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) are public. See Litter Control Program for Public Streets, Roads, and Highways, including rights of way for the non-private roadways.

In areas of new construction additional litter collection is provided by builder's personnel each workday.

3. - Description of Litter Control Program for Public Streets, Roads, and Highways including rights-of-way

All highways and streets within CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) have ongoing road right of way landscape maintenance. During landscape events litter collection is performed. As a residential area without through traffic the amount of litter collected is not significant and estimated at 20 gallons weekly and estimated at 8-10 pounds per cubic foot.

3. – Procedures for Street Sweeping for Highways and Streets, including rights of way, with curbs and gutters

Street cleanliness and prevention of roadway materials from entering the stormwater system is accomplished by various landscape contractors' practice of litter removal and blowing the residential streets to place any roadway located organic materials into the residential lot landscaping upon completion of a landscape maintenance events throughout the residential development. This practice reduces the effectiveness of street sweeping equipment to a minimal level.

In areas of new residential home construction the builder provides additional work day cleanup. Brushed material is placed in the construction area.

3. - Description of Road Repair Pollution Reduction

The roads within CFM Community Development District have not had the final lift of asphalt installed. Minor potholes are the typical repair and do not include soil disturbance activity. Any major road repairs will be performed by a qualified contractor and include road repair best management practices.

CFM CDD does not have within its boundary an equipment yard and maintenance shop that supports road maintenance activities. If in the future a roadway maintenance equipment yard and maintenance shop is added then Lee County standard practices will be modeled.

5 - Procedures for Municipal Waste Treatment, Storage, or Disposal Inspections

CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) is a residential development with no commercial area. The Lee County Planned Urban Development resolution does not include any provision for municipal waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities. There currently are not any facilities qualifying and the likelihood of this changing in the future is extremely low.

Lee County, NPDES permit lead co-permittee, monitors the municipal waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities in the surrounding area and is committed through an Interlocal Agreement to provide inspection assistance and enforcement to correct or eliminate runoff problems from municipal waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities.

6. - Procedures to Minimize Use of Pesticides, Herbicides, and Fertilizers

CFM Community Development District utilizes contractual agreements with qualified landscape contractors to maintain landscaped common areas it owns. The landscape contractors must be licensed to operate within Lee County and follow the guidelines of the Landscape and Fertilizer Ordinances. The Lee County licensing requirements include review of training and certification qualifications that landscape contractor's employees must possess.

Florida-friendly landscape and the associated fertilization requirements are considered in the landscape design by Landscape Architects during Common Area landscape design or redesign.

All inventory and storage is the responsibility of the landscape contractor and there are no chemical storage buildings onsite. The contractual terms are performance based which indirectly encourages minimizing use of chemicals to control operational costs.

. 7.c - Procedures for Proactive Inspection of Illicit Discharges and/or Improper Disposal

CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) follows the Lee County Proactive Inspection Protocol for Site Selection of Priority Areas. Currently, CFM CDD lacks areas meeting the Site Selection criterion. The stormwater system was constructed under a South Florida Water Management District Environmental Resource Permit, has no history of past illicit discharge or dumping, and does not have on-site disposal systems.

CFM CDD has a NPDES Permit Interlocal Agreement with the Lead Co-Permittee, Lee County, to provide a proactive inspection assistance and enforcement.

7.c - Procedures for Reactive Investigations to Identify Illicit Discharges and/or Illicit Disposal

CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) does not have regular onsite personnel. CFM CDD has a District Management that provides contract administration for maintenance of District owned stormwater system and common area landscape.

CFM CDD residents are primarily aware of the Lee County Illicit Discharge Hotline number of 533-9400 and contact Lee County directly with information concerning potential illicit discharges and/or improper disposal. Any request or complaint received by Lee County will be entered in the LDOT RFA. If investigation assistance is needed then a Lee County representative may contact the CFM CDD District Manager or District Engineer. In the case of District Management staff being able to make a timely initial evaluation of the complaint this action is undertaken before contacting Lee County.

In the case when a resident contacts a CFM CDD Supervisor the information is provided to District Management. When a Supervisor or resident contacts the District Management staff a determination is made whether a timely initial evaluation of the complaint is possible. If a timely response is not possible then the information is provided to Lee County NPDES Staff.

When an initial evaluation of the complaint is possible an attempt to resolve the condition is made before the location description and contacting residents address is provided to Lee County NPDES staff for entry into the Lee County LDOT RFA system. Lee County Site Inspection Protocol and Enforcement capability is put into action. The commitment to provide reactive investigations assistance and enforcement is a provision in an NPDES Permit Interlocal Agreement.

CFM Community Development District 7.d - Procedures for Spill Prevention and Spill Response

Spill Prevention

CFM Community Development District does not operate onsite facilities for the storage or use of chemicals or fluids that would utilize a spill prevention plan.

Spill Response

Residents within the CDD boundary contact the local fire district, North Fort Myers, either directly, (239) 997-8654 or via 911 to initiate spill response.

CFM Community Development District 7.g - Procedures to Reduce or Eliminate Sanitary Wastewater Contamination

CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) is a residential development within unincorporated Lee County. Upon construction completion of the sanitary system the system was transferred to North Fort Myers Utility. Currently the sanitary system is operated and maintained by Florida Governmental Utilities Association (FGUA)

Residents of CFM CDD receive updates and contact information from FGUA by mail. Any concerns a resident has about sanitary wastewater contamination can contact (239) 543-1005 during normal hours, after hoursthe call is automatically transferred.

If a resident contacts a CFM CDD Board of Supervisor then the contact information will be shared with the District Management staff who will ensure the concern has been provided to FGUA.

CFM Community Development District 9.b - Procedures for Construction Site Inspections

CFM Community Development District (CFM CDD) is a residential development within unincorporated Lee County. Lee County Department of Community Development has the responsibility for construction plan review and approval. Initiation of Construction Site Inspection is coordinated between Lee County Community Development and Lee County NPDES staff, see Lee County Construction Site Inspection Protocol.

In the case when a resident contacts a CFM CDD Supervisor the information is provided to District Management or if the resident directly contacts District Management staff due to the possibility of an Illicit Discharge that would impact the stormwater system then the CFM CDD 7.c_Reactive Investigation standard operating procedure is initiated.
