The District Agenda is comprised of five different sections:

The meeting will begin promptly at 11:00 a.m. with the first section which is called Public Comment. The Public Comment portion of the agenda is where individuals may comment on matters for which the Board may be taking action or that may otherwise concern the District. Each individual is limited to three (3) minutes for such comment. The Board of Supervisors or Staff is not obligated to provide a response until sufficient time for research or action is warranted. IF THE COMMENT CONCERNS A MAINTENANCE RELATED ITEM, THE ITEM WILL NEED TO BE ADDRESSED BY THE DISTRICT MANAGER OUTSIDE THE CONTEXT OF THIS MEETING. The second section is called Business Administration. The Business Administration section contains items that require the review and approval of the District Board of Supervisors as a normal course of business. The third section is called Business Items. The business items section contains items for approval by the District Board of Supervisors that may require discussion, motion and votes on an item-by-item basis. Occasionally, certain items for decision within this section are required by Florida Statute to be held as a Public Hearing. During the Public Hearing portion of the agenda item, each member of the public will be permitted to provide one comment on the issue, prior to the Board of Supervisors' discussion, motion and vote. fourth section is called Staff Reports. This section allows the District Manager, Engineer, and Attorney to update the Board of Supervisors on any pending issues that are being researched for Board action. The final section is called Supervisor Requests and Comments. This is the section in which the Supervisors may request Staff to prepare certain items in an effort to meet residential needs. Agendas can be reviewed by contacting the Manager's office at (239) 936-0913 at least seven days in advance of the scheduled meeting. Requests to place items on the agenda must be submitted in writing with an explanation to the District Manager at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the meeting.

Public workshops sessions may be advertised and held in an effort to provide informational services. These sessions allow staff or consultants to discuss a policy or business matter in a more informal manner and allow for lengthy presentations prior to scheduling the item for approval. Typically no motions or votes are made during these sessions.

Pursuant to provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act, any person requiring special accommodations to participate in this meeting is asked to advise the District Office at (239) 936-0913, at least 48 hours before the meeting. FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Call to Order

Ms. Blandon called the meeting to order and read the roll call.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Comment

Ms. Blandon opened the floor for public comment. Questions and comments from the public were entertained.

Mr. Dady provided an update regarding US 41 access to the community which is needed for completion of the community.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on February 16, 2017

Ms. Blandon presented the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' meeting held on February 16, 2017. She asked if there were any additions, deletions, or corrections to the minutes. There were none.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Mayotte, with all in favor, the Board approved the Minutes of the Board of Supervisors' Meeting held on February 16, 2017, for the CFM Community Development District.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of the Operations and Maintenance Expenditures for the Months of January, February, and March 2017

Ms. Blandon provided an overview of the expenditures paid for the period of January 1-31, 2017 which totaled \$14,473.21, the period of February 1-28, 2017 which totaled \$17,318.40, and the period of March 1-31, 2017 which totaled \$16,554.74. She asked if there were any questions related to any item of expenditure. Mr. Dady spoke regarding the cost for the aerators, he asked that Staff review the electrical expense and discuss a possible reduction with the Golf Club.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Lerner, with all in favor, the Board approved the Operations and Maintenance Expenditures for the Month of January 2017 which totaled \$14,473.21, the Month of February 2017 which totaled \$17,318.40 and the Month of March 2017 which totaled \$16,554.74, for the CFM Community Development District.

Mr. Eckert asked for a motion of the Board to amend the Agenda to include ratification of the issuance of the RFP for Mitigation Services as well as to add approval and ratification of the evaluation criteria.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board Amended the Agenda to Include Ratification of the Issuance of the RFP for Mitigation Services as well as to Add Approval and Ratification of the Evaluation Criteria, for the CFM Community Development District.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Ratification of the Issuance of the RFP for Mitigation Services

Mr. Dady advised the goal, aside from getting the best price for the District, is to ensure the District can work with the contractor. He advised that with exotic removal the work becomes difficult during the rainy season. Mr. Dady advised the scope of services has been revised for clarification in order to provide for more competitive bids.

Mr. Robson provided an overview of the process involved with clarification of the scope of services to include mechanical removal and not excluding stacking in place. He advised all previous bids were rejected and the process was started over in order to allow for stacking in place. Mr. Robson advised the biggest issue is timing and the schedule has been revised to lay out time periods of the work. He advised the planting schedule or requirement has been updated to state planting requirement is minimum one year maximum three years after removal. Mr.

Robson advised six firms have requested the RFP documents.

Mr. Robson advised a mandatory pre bid is being held today, and this is the opportunity for the bidders to ask questions on the specifications and the schedule. Mr. Dady inquired regarding getting a short list after the bids are received. Mr. Eckert advised the more contact outside of the RFP the more likely we are to have a bid protest. He advised the District can ask questions and addendums can be provided as a better process. Mr. Dady inquired regarding the dollar amount to trigger a public bid. Mr. Eckert advised that for maintenance activities the limit is \$195,000.00 and for construction or projects the level is \$360,000.00 to \$370,000.00. Discussion ensued regarding phasing the project on an annual basis.

Mr. Eckert provided an overview of the Evaluation Criteria. Discussion ensued. Mr. Dady provided changes to the criteria as follows: taking five points off man power and five points off maintenance and add those to the weight of cost, changing the wording on the schedule from shortest schedule to flexibility of schedule, lower references to five and add that also into cost.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Mayotte, with all in favor, the Board Ratified the Evaluation Criteria, as modified on the record, for the CFM Community Development District.

On a Motion by Mr. Lerner, seconded by Mr. Dady, with all in favor, the Board Ratified the Issuance of the RFP for Mitigation Initial Exotic and Nuisance Species Eradication, for the CFM Community Development District.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Audit for Fiscal Year End September 30, 2016 as Prepared by Carr, Riggs & Ingram

Ms. Blandon provided an overview of the Audit for Fiscal Year end September 30, 2016 as prepared by Carr, Riggs & Ingram advising as per the Auditors opinion the statements present fairly in all material aspects the financial position of the governmental activities and each major fund of the District as of September 30, 2016. Mr. Dady requested that he be provided with the Audit in advance so that he can provide feedback to the Auditing firm. Discussion ensued. Ms. Blandon advised she will look into Mr. Dady's concerns. Further discussion ensued.

On a Motion by Mr. Dady, seconded by Mr. Bishop, with all in favor, the Board Accepted the Audit for Fiscal Year End September 30, 2016 as Prepared by Carr, Riggs & Ingram, for the CFM Community Development District.

<u>Walton Ranch</u>: In 2015, BIO-TECH successfully completed a 1 year contract on the 3,760-acre Walton Ranch preserve in Sarasota County. The project scope included the identification and treatment of nuisance and exotic species throughout the site and to treat 998.5 acres specifically for devil's horsewhip (*Achyranthes aspera* var. *pubescens*) scattered throughout the mesic hammock communities. The project site conditions required that all the devil's horsewhip within the 998.5 acres be treated by backpack sprayer.



Ginn Mitigation Tract: BIO-TECH successfully signed-off a 363-acre wetland enhancement area located within the more than 850-acre Boggy Creek swamp, in southern Orange County, FL. 

EarthBalance® was contracted by the USFWS to eradicate Melaleuca (*Melaleuca quinquenervia*), Old World climbing fern (*Lygodium microphyllum*) and all other FLEPPC listed Category I and II species within delineated project boundaries on the A.R.M. Loxahatchee NWR located in Palm Beach County, Florida. The A.R.M. Loxahatchee NWR is a 143,395-acre remnant of the northern Everglades consisting of a mosaic of tree islands, sawgrass marsh, wet prairie, and open sloughs. The current treated acreage is 6,931 acres.

Treatment was performed using a 30-man crew and five airboats. Airboat crews navigated along existing airboat trails to one treatment cell at a time based upon water levels. Within each cell, the crews systematically treated target species on each of the tree islands by traversing the islands on foot along parallel transects that extended outward into the sawgrass until climbing fern or other target species were no longer seen. The crews then either converged upon any large strand islands as a large team to attack dense concentrations, or they traveled separately to different "pop-up" islands within the same cell to treat less dense concentrations of climbing fern.

Upon arrival at each island, the Crew Supervisor kept the airboat itself away from relatively dense infestations and remained at idle speed within the treatment area to minimize any unnecessary drafting and spraying of spores. Once an island was sufficiently treated based on QA/QC scouting by the Crew Supervisor, the crew was



transported to the next island requiring treatment. As they traveled from island to island, each crew systematically scanned the marsh with a "line of sight" method and stopped to either hand-pull seedling melaleuca or treat larger specimens that were observable from the airboat. Once all of the islands were completed in a particular cell, we examined our GPS tracks and canvassed any open areas not previously traversed to ensure that all melaleuca and any other target species were identified and treated. Treatment methods used were foliar, cut-stump, and frill and girdle.

EarthBalance® supplied all labor, equipment, and material necessary for the treatment of melaleuca (Melaleuca quinquenervia), Old World climbing fern (*Lygodium microphyllum*), and Brazilian pepper (*Schinus terebinthifolius*) within about 729,000 acres of mostly roadless areas of Big Cypress National Park. All melaleuca (*Melaleuca quinquenervia*) was treated regardless of size using cut stump or foliar application. Old World climbing fern (*Lygodium microphyllum*) was treated by hand cutting vertical stems followed by foliar applications. Utilizing off road equipment such as ATVs and light steel bottom airboats we were able to access the extremely rugged terrain that is usually very difficult to traverse effectively. GPS data were collected, downloaded, and maps printed for treatment points. Data were entered on Daily Progress Treatment reports and into the WEEDDAR database.




Environmental Considerations:

Big Cypress National Preserve is a delicate mixed wetland environment. All crew members were made aware of the wide range of native plant communities that are found within the treatment area. These communities include species such as muhly grass (*Muhlenbergia filipes*), sawgrass (*Cladium jamaicense*), nodding beakrush (*Rhynchospora microcarpa*), and panic grass (*Panicum tenerum*). The communities also include several state listed threatened/endangered plants including bracted colicroot (*Aletris bracteata*), yellow flax (*Linum carteri*), meadow jointvetch (*Aeschynomene pratensis*), Everglades key pencilflower (*Stylosanthes calcicola*), Wright's pineland fern (*Anemia wrightii*), and powdery strap airplant (*Catopsis berteroniana*).

To avoid any site damage, various precautions were taken. Foliar application used low-pressure spray to minimize drift and surfactants were used to ensure proper adhesion. All chemicals were used with care against runoff and a colored dye was added. Weekly progress reports were kept documenting type and amount of chemical used, treatment types, and location of treatment.

GENERAL FUND BUDGET ACCOUNT CATEGORY DESCRIPTION

The General Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are subject to change at any time depending on its application to the District. Please note, not all General Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are applicable to the District indicated above. Uses of the descriptions contained herein are intended for general reference.

REVENUES:

Tax Roll: The District levies Non-Ad Valorem Special Assessments on all of the assessable property within the District to pay for operating expenditures incurred during the Fiscal Year. The assessments may be collected in two ways. The first is by placing them on the County's Tax Roll, to be collected with the County's Annual Property Tax Billing. This method is only available to land properly platted within the time limits prescribed by the County.

Off Roll: For lands not on the tax roll and that is by way of a direct bill from the District to the appropriate property owner.

EXPENDITURES – ADMINISTRATIVE:

Supervisor Fees: The District may compensate its supervisors within the appropriate statutory limits of \$200.00 maximum per meeting within an annual cap of \$4,800.00 per supervisor.

Administrative Services: The District will incur expenditures for the day to today operation of District matters. These items include but are not limited to mailing and preparation of agenda packages, overnight deliveries, facsimiles and long distance phone calls.

Also, each Board Supervisor and the District Staff are entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses per Florida Statutes 190.006(8). Finally, this line item also includes a cost for the storage of all the District's official records, supplies and files.

District Management: The District as required by statute, will contract with a firm to provide for management and administration of the District's day to day administrative needs. The cost to maintain the minutes of all Board meetings, preparing various resolutions and all other secretarial duties requested by the District throughout the year is also reflected in this amount.

District Engineer: The District's engineer provides general engineering services to the District. Among these services are attendance at and preparation for monthly board meetings, review of construction invoices and all other engineering services requested by the district throughout the year.



Disclosure Report: The District is required to file quarterly and annual disclosure reports, as required in the District's Trust Indenture, with the specified repositories. This is contracted out to a third party in compliance with the Trust Indenture.

Trustee's Fees: The District will incur annual trustee's fees upon the issuance of bonds for the oversight of the various accounts relating to the bond issues.

Assessment Roll: The District will contract with a firm to maintain the assessment roll and annually levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment for operating and debt service expenses.

Financial & Revenue Collections: Services include, but are not limited to responding to bondholder questions, prepayment analysis, long term pay-offs and true-up analysis. This line item also includes the fees incurred for a Collection Agent to collect the funds for the principal and interest payment for its short-term bond issues and any other bond related collection needs. These funds are collected as prescribed in the Trust Indenture. The Collection Agent also provides for the release of liens on property after the full collection of bond debt levied on particular properties.

Accounting Services: The District has contracted for maintenance of accounting records. These services include, but are not limited to accounts payable, accounts receivable and preparation of financial reports for the district. This also includes all preparations necessary for the fiscal year end audits to be done.

Auditing Services: The District is required annually to conduct an audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting firm, once it reaches certain revenue and expenditure levels, or has issued bonds and incurred debt.

Arbitrage Rebate Calculation: The District is required to calculate the interest earned from bond proceeds each year pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The Rebate Analyst is required to verify that the District has not received earnings higher than the yield of the bonds.

Public Officials Liability Insurance: The District will incur expenditures for public officials' liability insurance for the Board and Staff.

Legal Advertising: The District will incur expenditures related to legal advertising. The items for which the District will advertise include, but are not limited to meeting schedules, special meeting notices, and public hearings, bidding etc. for the District based on statutory guidelines

Dues, Licenses & Fees: The District is required to pay an annual fee to the Department of Economic Opportunity, along with other items which may require licenses or permits, etc.

Website Hosting, Maintenance and Email: The District may incur fees as they relate to the development and ongoing maintenance of its own website along with possible email services if requested.

District Counsel: The District's legal counsel provides general legal services to the District. Among these services are attendance at and preparation for monthly board meetings, review of operating and maintenance contracts and all other legal services requested by the district throughout the year.



EXPENDITURES - FIELD OPERATIONS:

Security Services and Patrols: The District may wish to contract with a private company to provide security for the District.

Electric Utility Services: The District will incur electric utility expenditures for general purposes such as irrigation timers, lift station pumps, fountains, etc.

Street Lights: The District may have expenditures relating to street lights throughout the community. These may be restricted to main arterial roads or in some cases to all street lights within the District's boundaries.

Aquatic Maintenance: Expenses related to the care and maintenance of the lakes and ponds for the control of nuisance plant and algae species.

Fountain Service Repairs & Maintenance: The District may incur expenses related to maintaining the fountains within throughout the Parks & Recreational areas

Lake/Pond Bank Maintenance: The District may incur expenditures to maintain lake banks, etc. for the ponds and lakes within the District's boundaries, along with planting of beneficial aquatic plants, stocking of fish, mowing and landscaping of the banks as the District determines necessary.

Wetland Monitoring & Maintenance: The District may be required to provide for certain types of monitoring and maintenance activities for various wetlands and waterways by other governmental entities.

General Liability Insurance: The District will incur fees to insure items owned by the District for its general liability needs

Property Insurance: The District will incur fees to insure items owned by the District for its property needs

Landscape Maintenance: The District will incur expenditures to maintain the rights-of-way, median strips, recreational facilities including pond banks, entryways, and similar planting areas within the District. These services include but are not limited to monthly landscape maintenance, fertilizer, pesticides, annuals, mulch, and irrigation repairs.

Irrigation Repairs: The District will incur expenditures related to repairs of the irrigation systems.

Landscape Replacement: Expenditures related to replacement of turf, trees, shrubs etc.

Sidewalk Repair & Maintenance: Expenses related to sidewalks located in the right of way of streets the District may own if any.

Roadway Repair & Maintenance: Expenses related to the repair and maintenance of roadways owned by the District if any.



Miscellaneous Contingency: Monies collected and allocated for expenses that the District could incur throughout the year, which may not fit into any standard categories.

Capital Outlay: Monies collected and allocated for various projects as they relate to public improvements.

DEBT SERVICE FUND BUDGET ACCOUNT CATEGORY DESCRIPTION

The Debt Service Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are subject to change at any time depending on its application to the District. Please note, not all Debt Service Fund Budget Account Category Descriptions are applicable to the District indicated above. Uses of the descriptions contained herein are intended for general reference.

REVENUES:

Special Assessments: The District may levy special assessments to repay the debt incurred by the sale of bonds to raise working capital for certain public improvements. The assessments may be collected in the same fashion as described in the Operations and Maintenance Assessments.

EXPENDITURES - ADMINISTRATIVE:

Bank Fees: The District may incur bank service charges during the year.

Debt Service Obligation: This would a combination of the principal and interest payment to satisfy the annual repayment of the bond issue debt.
